Biotin

The use of biotin and methionine is both natural and effective. Biotin is not a medicine but an essential nutrient. Created in the gut by bacteria, this B-complex vitamin acts as a coenzyme; a catalyst that quickens the speed and efficiency of hoof growth. If a horse is not producing enough biotin, then poor form will develop, whether this be thin, fragile hoof wall, or a wall that is so crumbly that it cannot hold a shoe. These debilitating conditions, caused by a biotin deficiency, can be easily corrected by the horse owner without the expense of patented medicines or veterinarian time. Supplemental dietary biotin will redress the deficiency and therefore provide a simple and natural treatment. As biotin is water-soluble and thus cannot be stored in tissue, this course of supplemental biotin should be administered for 6-9 months.

Biotin alone, however, may not be enough. Other nutrients are also essential for healthy horn growth. The wise horse owner will not gamble on biotin deficiency being the sole cause of degrading hoof quality. It would be a mistake to commit oneself to a 9-month course of biotin, only to realize part way through that additional nutrients were needed.

Methionine

For many years the amino acid methionine has been recognized as one of the major nutrients necessary in the production of premium hoof quality. The hoof horn, composed of the protein keratin, requires methionine for its correct protein development. Necessary for the production of cystine which in turn produces keratin, decreased levels of dietary methionine will affect both hoof growth and integrity. As with biotin, the common sense solution for methionine deficiency is for the horse owner to restore sufficient levels of methionine to the horse's diet through supplementation. It

is the most affordable and simplest solution to a problem and it allows the owner to hold the reins and control the horse's well-being.

Hoof and Nutrition

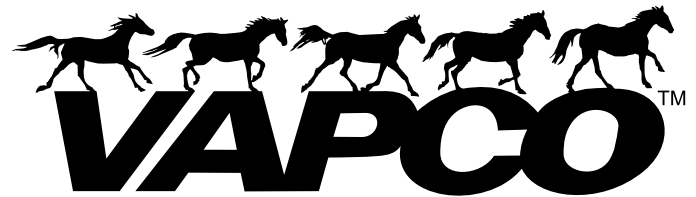
As a horse owner with an animal with poor hoof form, and realizing that healthy hoof horn cannot be created without proper nutrition, the most natural and effective intervention will take the form of supplemental dietary biotin with methionine. Veterinarians, farriers, and horse owners all attest to the value of a concentrated source of these two essential nutrients. Ingredients

Feeding

Feed 1 ounce daily maintenance, for an average 1000lb horse. Increasing the feeding levels to 2 ounces, for the first 30 days, is recommended. Adjust feeding levels based on body weight.
